





Science-The World around Us

Science is the pursuit and application of knowledge and understanding of the natural and social world following a systematic methodology based on evidence.

Scientific methodology includes the following: Objective, observation, measurement, data, reading, experimentation and possibly using mathematics as a tool. Science is everywhere. This means that if you take or observe anything, any animal, food, plant etc. you can find or learn something new which is science. Now science is not only a subject but it has types or sub-subjects. There are four major branches of science; each branch is categorized in different type of subjects that covers different areas of studies such as chemistry, physics, math, astronomy etc. The four major branches of science are Mathematics and logic, biological science, physical science and social science. Following are branches of science.

- 1. Genetics- The study of heredity and DNA**
- 2. Oceanology- The study of oceans**
- 3. Physics- The study of motion and force**
- 4. Zoology- The study of animals**
- 5. Astronomy- The study of stars**
- 6. Marine biology- The study of plants and animals that live in the ocean**

The first person credited with being employed as a science teacher in a British public school was William Sharp, who left the job at Rugby School in 1850 after establishing science to the curriculum. Sharp is said to have established a model for science to be taught throughout the British public school system. The British Academy for the Advancement of Science (BAAS) published a report in 1867 calling for the teaching of "pure science" and training of the "scientific habit of mind." The progressive education movement supported the ideology of mental training through the sciences. BAAS emphasized separately pre-professional training in secondary science education. In this way, future BAAS members could be prepared. This may be the brief explanation for evolution for the 'learning of science', but the discovery of science had originally taken much earlier.

SRINIVAS RAMANUJAN



Srinivasa Ramanujan was an Indian mathematician who lived during the British Rule in India. Though he had almost no formal training in pure mathematics, he made substantial contributions to mathematical analysis, number theory, infinite series, and continued fractions, including solutions to mathematical problems then considered unsolvable.

He was born on the 22nd of December 1887 into a Tamil Brahmin Iyengar family. His father, Kuppuswamy Srinivasa Iyengar, originally from Thanjavur district, worked as a clerk in a sari shop. His mother, Komalatammal, was a housewife and sang at a local temple. Their family home on Sarangapani Sannidhi Street is now a museum.

A child prodigy by age 11, he had exhausted the mathematical knowledge of two college students who were lodgers at his home. He mastered advanced trigonometry by the age of 13 while discovering sophisticated theorems on his own. He contributed a lot towards Mathematics and dedicated all his years for this.

He died on 26th April 1920 at the age of 32. During his short life Ramanujan independently compiled nearly 3,900 results (mostly identities and equations).

In 2011, on the 125th anniversary of his birth, the Indian government declared that 22nd December as National Mathematics Day.

India is and will always be proud of Srinivas Ramanujan for his supreme contribution in the field of Mathematics.
